2023-159	MRC VG support - Gens-de-Terre bridge reconstruction project on chemin Lépine- Clova - Request for emergency decree
	Whereas resolution 2022-R-AG283 adopted on August 23, 2022 by the MRC Vallée-de- la-Gatineau (MRC);
	Whereas it is necessary to relaunch the request in order to adequately meet the needs of users in the Outaouais and Laurentians regions;
	Whereas chemin Lépine-Clova is a major inter-regional road axis and is recognized as part of the Laurentians-Outaouais region's priority multi-use road network;
	Whereas this road is the gateway for several hundred vacation leaseholders, and also provides access to several structured wildlife territories (outfitters, ZECs and SEPAQs) in the Laurentians and Outaouais region;
	Whereas Chemin Lépine-Clova is also an important link with the Abitibi and Mauricie regions;

	Whereas the forest management units (FMUs) served by this roadway contain large volumes of wood intended to supply regional processing plants.
	Whereas the Rivière Gens de Terre bridge is located on the first section of the Lépine- Clova road, and the reduction in tonnage to 15 tonnes limits the supply of essential goods to the outfitters concerned;
	Whereas the pandemic and forest fires have already weakened the economic health of these outfitters, the alarming situation of not rebuilding the bridge could lead to the definitive end of these companies' economic activities;
	Whereas the estimated costs of this reconstruction are currently in the order of plus or minus 6.5 million;
	Whereas a geotechnical study has been carried out by the foresters and no action has been taken to date;
	Whereas the regional players impacted by this work have already agreed to participate in the project's financial package by providing a sum equivalent to 10% of the total cost currently estimated, i.e. more or less \$650,000;
	Whereas there is an urgent need for action in terms of user safety and the economic impact on the Outaouais and Laurentides regions;
	Whereas no action has been taken by the Ministry for over a year, and the Ministry is unaware of the urgency and impact of refusing to pay the full cost of the urgent reconstruction of the Gens-de-Terre bridge;
	In view of all the safety consequences for users of this bridge, as well as the magnitude of the economic impact, the MRC is requesting an urgent decree;

	Whereas the governments of Quebec and Canada are currently negotiating the renewal of the Quebec Gas Tax and Contribution Program (TECQ) for the period 2024 - 2028;
	Whereas on August 24, 2023, the Board of Directors of the Fédération québécoise des municipalités (FQM) called on the governments of Quebec and Canada to reach an early agreement to ensure the renewal of this important program;
	Whereas this program is essential to the realization of important projects in Quebec communities;
	Whereas, despite the substantial sums allocated to this program, they remain insufficient to meet needs, and must be increased due to the rising costs of carrying out projects;
	Whereas the Federation of Canadian Municipalities has asked the federal government to double its investment in this program, and to provide for an indexation of 3.5% per year;
	Whereas the FQM and its members have been asking for several years that the Quebec Gas Tax and Contribution Program (TECQ) allow for the financing and realization of projects planned and decided by Quebec municipalities, in the sense that municipal

	building projects (garages, town halls, fire stations, etc.) and work on retention structures (dams, dikes, etc.) be eligible for this program;
	Whereas, despite the request to include municipal buildings, it is essential to maintain financial assistance programs specifically dedicated to these infrastructures;
	Whereas it is important to adapt programs to the challenges posed by climate change, and to enable municipalities to finance the implementation of developments and work to adapt to the consequences of these changes, such as the creation of firebreaks to protect forest communities;
	Whereas the reporting requirements for projects are onerous for municipalities;
	Whereas negotiations must be concluded by early fall 2023 to ensure implementation on January 1, 2024, and to enable municipalities to budget for investments;
	Whereas the sums allocated to this program must be free of any new obligations or conditions to ensure its success;

	Whereas the MRC Vallée-de-la-Gatineau (MRC) has been at the heart of a PFM Politique Familiale Municipale (PFM) - Municipalité Amies Des Ainées (MADA) collective approach bringing together twelve (12) municipalities on its territory since 2017 ;
	Whereas the MRC Vallée-de-la-Gatineau has been accredited MADA following the development of its Politique aînés and its action plan in favor of seniors;
	Whereas twelve (12) MRC municipalities have been part of the PFM-MADA collective approach since 2017, namely Aumond, Bois-Franc, Cayamant, Déléage, Denholm, Gracefield, Grand-Remous, Lac-Sainte-Marie, Low, Messines, Montcerf-Lytton and Sainte-Thérèse-de-la-Gatineau;
	Whereas the Municipality of the Township of Low is part of the MRC's PFM-MADA collective approach and wishes to continue its involvement in this process;
	Whereas it is possible that other municipalities in the MRC will join the collective approach;
	Whereas component 2 of the MADA approach for the implementation of the last MRC policy and action plan expired in March 2023;
	Whereas there is a need to update the MADA policies and action plans for the MRC, especially in a post-pandemic context where the needs of seniors are potentially changed;
	Whereas the Secrétariat aux aînés of the Ministère de la Santé et des Services Sociaux has opened a call for MADA project volet 1: Soutien à la réalisation de politiques et de plans d'action en faveur des aînés 2023-2024 ;
	Whereas the work involved will be an update of the existing policy and action plans that will touch on the three (3) pillars of active aging, i.e. health, safety and social participation, and this spread over the nine (9) MADA fields of action;
	Whereas this work will be carried out over a 2-year period, and will involve the creation of steering committees in each participating municipality, as well as at the MRC;
	Whereas these steering committees will then be responsible for establishing a new social diagnosis that will be used to update the policy and action plan of the MRC and each participating municipality;
	Whereas the work will be carried out under the coordination of the MRC, through its collective PFM-MADA approach, and in collaboration with the elected representatives of the Family-Seniors Issues (RQFA) of each municipality, as well as their respective steering/monitoring committees.
	Whereas the workload that this update may represent can be very heavy for the MRC and participating municipalities;
	Whereas a coordination resource, Mr. Marc-André Gauthier, is already employed by the Table de development social Vallée-de-la-Gatineau and is responsible for the PFM-MADA file on behalf of the MRC;
	Whereas Mr. Gauthier was responsible over the past year for the implementation of volet 2 and its final reporting, and will do the same for the call for projects for volet 1 2023-2024.

Whereas Joanie Courchaine, Director General of the MRC, will be the MRC representative responsible for following up on the financial assistance application, as
well as for signing the financial assistance agreement and rendering an account;
Whereas the elected RQFA representative in the municipality of the Township of Low is Maureen McEvoy;
Whereas the substitute RQFA elected official in the municipality of the Township of Low is Luc Thivierge.
Whereas funding amounts to \$8,000 per participating municipality.
Whereas the collective approach does not involve any additional financial contribution from participating municipalities.
Whereas the program involves a financial contribution from the MRC equivalent to 15% of eligible expenses under the program;
