Hydro-Québec to inspect some of its transmission lines in the Outaouais and Laurentians regions



Residents of the Outaouais and Laurentians could well see a helicopter in the sky during the week of February 19, 2024. Hydro-Québec will be carrying out thermographic inspections of some of its transmission lines.

The purpose of the inspection is to identify and replace certain transmission line components that, over time, are more likely to cause service interruptions due to failure.

The operation is part of Hydro-Québec's priority to improve the quality and reliability of its power transmission network, which comprises over 11,5,000 km of lines.

The Hydro-Québec helicopter will fly over several regions.

The helicopter that will be criss-crossing the skies could therefore linger on certain components of the transmission lines, which might seem odd to observers not familiar with the operation.

The helicopter inspection could take place over two or three days, depending on weather conditions.

More specifically, a line inspection is planned in the following regions:
